COLONEL TIMOTHY T. MARTIN

Colonel Timothy T. Martin is the Deputy Commander, Air National Guard Readiness Center, Joint Base Andrews, Maryland. He is responsible for assisting the Air National Guard Readiness Center Commander with resourcing, oversight, guidance and execution of a more than \$11 billion annual appropriation to enable mission readiness of 108,100 military and civilian personnel in 90 wings throughout the United States, District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam and the Virgin Islands. Colonel Martin is dual-hatted as the Commander of the 201st Mission Support Squadron. In this role, he exercises command and control over Air National Guard assigned units and members. He is the Title 10 commander for the nearly 5,000 Air National Guard members serving on Title 10 orders worldwide.

Colonel Martin enlisted in the United States Army in September 1991. Following his active-duty tour, he enlisted in the 174th Fighter Wing, New York Air National Guard as a Logistics Specialist. He was one of the first to respond to the September 11, 2001 catastrophe, fundamental to the security and personnel recovery team. Colonel Martin was also a civilian Software Engineer for Lockheed Martin, Naval Electronics and Subsurface Sonar, Syracuse, N.Y. In April 2002, he received his commission from the Academy of Military Science in Knoxville, Tennessee as a



distinguished graduate and became the Chief of Supply, 174th Logistics Readiness Squadron. In 2008, on his deployment to Afghanistan with the Combined Joint Special Operations Command, he deployed the first RC-26 unit in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. In 2010, as the Aircraft Maintenance Commander he converted the squadron from supporting F-16 aircraft to supporting MQ-9 aircraft. Col Martin was assigned as the Program Integration Brach Chief, Logistics Panel Chair at the ANGRC in 2015 where he was responsible for the programming, planning and budget execution for the Air National Guard's annual weapon system sustainment, flying hour, transportation, and logistics programs with requirements more than \$5.1 billion dollars annually. He was the Commander for the 146th Maintenance Group in 2020, in 2021 became the Vice Commander, 146th Airlift Wing, responsible for maintaining a combat-ready organization prepared to support the U.S. and allied forces during contingency operations with tactical airlift, aeromedical evacuation, disaster response, humanitarian relief, as well as providing large scale aerial firefighting capabilities to both the state and nation with the Modular Airborne Fire Fighting System (MAFFS).

Prior to this assignment, Colonel Martin was the Principal Deputy Director of Logistics, Engineering and Force Protection, National Guard Bureau, Air National Guard Readiness Center, Joint Base Andrews, Maryland.
