Headquarters ANG Title 10 2-4 year Statutory Tour at **NGB/JA (Washington, DC)**. Must be Air Force Specialty Code (AFSC) **51J3/4**. Duties and Responsibilities: This position is with NGB-JA in direct support of the ANGRC and 201MSS. The Office of the Chief Counsel is a joint legal office which addresses issues pertaining to the Army National Guard (ARNG) (the state militia), the Army National Guard of the United States (ARNGUS) (a reserve component of the Army), the Air National Guard of the United States (ANGUS) (a reserve component of the Air Force). The incumbent must be able in the long-term to work in a NGB joint environment and handle Army and Air issues as assigned running the gamut of the administrative and operational law arena. The incumbent will provide legal counsel and written opinions in many subject areas including, but not limited to, the following.

Applicant should have knowledge of: UCMJ and implications of duty statuses (T10/T32) on UCMJ actions, Administrative Separation Actions and ANGRC Stat Tour Curtailment process, IG investigations and Command Directed Investigations, mobilization issues involving volunteerism, contingency operations, the Presidential Selected Reserve Call-Up, partial mobilization, stop loss, full mobilization, total mobilization, Legal advice provided on military personnel law including accessions, promotions, separations and retirement; pay and allowances, bonus programs, and travel and transportation allowances; release of information under Freedom of Information Act and Privacy Act, Reviews of personnel policy changes, draft instructions, regulations and MOA/MOUs for compliance with law, provide support to ANG JA Functional Area Manager as requested.

Mandatory criteria as indicated in the MVA must be documented on the members report on individual personnel (RIP). If it is not indicated on the RIP, it is incumbent upon the applicant to ensure that the appropriate source documentation is provided with the application.

Must meet the above stated grade/rank requirement by closeout date of advertisement.

Member must have a Secret Clearance or an open investigation to apply for statutory tour positions.

Officers applying for a statutory tour position must have a Juris Doctorate and State BAR license to be qualified.
