1. Requirements

Must hold Rank/Grade requirement by this announcement closeout date.

Must have or be qualified to obtain a Top Secret Security Clearance.

Must be a rated officer on current flying status or be able to regain currency.

Lt Col Applicants must submit all OPRs; have a DOR no later than 30 Dec 2010 and an MSD on or after 1 Oct 2017.

2. Position Description

Responsible for managing all Air National Guard Ground, Flight, Weapons and Space Safety programs for all flying units and mission support units encompassing over 105,400 members. Principal advisor to Director, Air National Guard and Air National Guard Readiness Center Commander for all safety issues. Interfaces with USAF and MAJCOM officers in charge of functional areas concerning issues of policies and procedures. Provides guidance and assistance to all Air National Guard field units regarding the development, interpretation, and implementation of policies, policy directives, policy instructions, and procedures. Unit level safety experience highly desired. Graduate of Air Force Safety Courses (including Board President (BP), Aircraft Mishap Investigation Course (AMIC), and Safety Program Management (SPM) or ARC Chief of Safety (ARCCOS)) is highly desired. Candidate should possess exceptional communicative skills, both oral and written, and possess a wide working knowledge of all ANG units and their various support elements. Staff experience at the numbered air force, MAJCOM, or headquarters level desired. Provides immediate technical and general advisory support directly to the Director, Air and Space Operations and staff. Acts as the Air National Guard's focal point on all matters pertaining to Ground, Flight, Weapons, and Space Safety. Responsible for providing assistance and coordination on the development of Air Force safety policy as it affects the Air National Guard. Responsible for ensuring the review and monitoring of all Air National Guard inspection reports for the identification of trends that could degrade overall mission capability or impact safety. Ensures the provision of inspection information to all Air National Guard staff agencies, field commanders and to the Adjutants General for the purpose of directing the necessary corrective actions/management efforts, when required.. Represents the Director, Air National on all matters pertaining to Safety with USAF Inspector General, Air Force Safety Center, and all gaining MAJCOMs. Responsible for the coordination with ANGRC Staff, National Guard Bureau Joint Staff, MAJCOMs and units relating to all aspects of Air Force and Air National Guard safety. Performs requisite liaison with public and private agencies to keep current and engaged with industry-leading safety programs and initiatives and coordinates on all Air National Guard Safety related issues. Conducts staff assistance visits to Air National Guard units to observe and access results of inspections. Provides USAF inspection and survey teams with assistance in the inspection of Air National Guard units, when necessary. Responsible for the preparation and presentation of all Air National Guard Safety inputs to the Program Objective Memorandum (POM).

3. Application Reminders

Pen/ink changes to any source document, i.e. Report on Individual Personnel (RIP), Evaluations could result in disapproval.

It is your responsibility to ensure your vMPF Personnel RIP is in order prior to application submittal. This includes but not limited to, verifying Duty History, AFSC, Service Dates and ensuring overdue TDY codes are cleared.

4. About Statutory Tours

This is a fully funded Permanent Change of Station (PCS). Visit DFAS website for most current Basic Allowance Housing (BAH) & Basic Allowance Substance (BAS) rates for the duty location listed on this announcement.

All Members assigned to the Statutory Tour program will remain affiliated their State/Territory while serving on Statutory Tour.

All field members to include AGR, Technicians & Drill Status Guardsmen must obtain State TAG approval with application submittal. Members currently assigned to the Statutory Tour program must obtain current Director approval.

Statutory Tour service time does not count toward Reduced Eligibility Age for Reserve Retirement Pay.

Statutory Tour members may be eligible for the Post 9/11 GI Bill if they serve on active duty Title 10 and/or Title 32 502(f) AGR for 90 days or more, after 11 September 2001. Their eligibility percentage starts at 40% for 90 days to 5 months. It increases 10% every 6 months, maxing out at 100%.
