Maj. Gen. Steven S. Nordhaus is the Commander, Air National Guard Readiness Center, Joint Base Andrews, Maryland. As Commander, he leads the Air Directorate Staff in support of formulating all plans, policies, programs and execution of the Air National Guard's more than \$10 billion annual appropriation, enabling the mission readiness of more than 105,000 military and civilian personnel in 90 wings throughout the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam and the Virgin Islands. Maj. Gen. Nordhaus is a principal adviser to the Director, Air National Guard on field-level resourcing, planning and execution.

Maj. Gen. Nordhaus graduated from the United States Air Force Academy in 1989 with Bachelor of Science in Engineering. He has flown combat missions in operations Southern Watch, Vigilant Warrior, Northern Watch, Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom.

Prior to assuming his current position, the general served as the Deputy Director of Operations, Headquarters North American Aerospace Defense Command, Peterson Air Force Base, Colorado.
